

An iconic building and unique composite site: Britain's first modernist block of flats, now also a gallery, and bordering a nature reserve. The design respects the separate functions of these spaces and unifies them.


concept | revealing journeys

Inspired by the work and journeys of Bauhaus designers in exile. Train lines traverse either end of the building deep below ground, which I felt was an eloquent metaphor for arrivals and departures in the first years of The Isokon, as well as for visitors today, as more people than ever are drawn to this historic site.






bespoke timber bird table with CorTen steel face, cut outs in the surface for birdfeed and water, timber infill blocks fit each recess so it becomes a console table



Priory School The Quad


the brief

Create a student-centred practical space with plenty of seating for break times. Reflect Priory school's ambition to be sustainable and to cater for all additional needs and abilities.

concept



Janus, Roman god of transitions, oversees students on the brink of adulthood. The Quad is designed for resilience and longevity. The planting reflects this ethos and embodies it symbolically.






existing asphalt retained^I

self-binding gravel 'repair' of new edge.

Existing hard surfaces used where possible. New landscaped areas carved from asphalt. Path edge repaired with porous self-binding gravel and recyclable steel edge. Gabions hold all waste material on site. See colour visual opposite




Quercus cerris, chosen for its greater climate resilience than our traditional symbol of longevity Q. robur, emerges over time as the Quad's main focal point, reaching 18-30m in 20 years.

Priory School The Courtyard

the brief

Internal courtyard garden accessed from the staff room to include social and private areas, including space to work outdoors. Disrupt views into courtyard from classrooms above.



Havelock Road Wimbledon

the brief

A calming garden which encourages mindful living for Hollie, who has a background in the arts and makes ceramics/ sculpture, and her family. Can also become a social space for up to 15 people.

concept

Geometry is derived from local design vernacular, the client's love of the mountains and the Wabi-Sabi aesthetic. It is as though a fragmented garden has been disrupted again, and the fragments reassembled, mindfully, one final time.

No Man's Land


"If rainforests are the lungs of the planet, then wetlands are the lifeblood" Wildfowl & Wetlands Trust

No Man's Land is a conceptual garden about wetlands - the critical role they play in the functioning of our planet and the abuse to which they have been subjected.






