

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
HOSPITALITY Cocktail Bar **DESIGN**

BRIEF & CONCEPT


The client wants a dark and sexy cocktail bar for the 21+ age demographic. Satellite was the chosen concept, symbolising leaving reality behind and entering a space of intrigue.

BAR PLAN









To embody the conceptual sense of force, string installations utilising fibre optics create tension and link all areas of the bar, sculpting the space beyond standard walls. Each corner offers unique views through asymmetric yet balanced strings, keeping customers intrigued. Seating areas are framed to provide different perspectives on each visit.









A monochromatic purple colour scheme engages individuals visually and emotionally, highlighting the texture and form of the string installations. Materials like plum leathers and plush velvets curate the desired aesthetic, while high gloss laminate flooring reflects the strings, enhancing immersion.




RESIDENTIAL Battersea DESIGN Apartment


BRIEF & CONCEPT

The brief was to design a new shell apartment at Battersea Power Station for a young professional teacher with varied interests in travel and photography, each interest with conflicting yet complementary ideals. This led to the Paradox concept.


- » Dislocating forms





The apartment is divided into three columns, with the widest for the living area.

Eco Eyewear Pop-Up




Eco Eyewear needed a sustainable pop-up shop at Westfield White City. As the first sustainable eyewear brand, the whole design had to reflect their sustainability mission, with Momentum driving that conceptual design intent.

- » Simplified assembly at various locations











SUSTAINABILITY FOCUS


Using a grid structure, shapes were tessellated from cut-outs for the pop-up's exterior design.

The pop-up used three core materials, each aligned with Eco's sustainability vision and part of a circular economy. These materials return to the product cycle at the end of their lifecycle, minimising waste.


RHN Staff Facilities

BRIEF & CONCEPT

As the Project Manager of a six-member design team, we were tasked with redesigning the staff facilities at The Royal Hospital of Neuro-Disability, a Grade II* listed building in Putney. Our goal was to open up the space and enhance staff welfare, making them the centre of the hospital, through the concept of Nexus.



FLOORPLAN





We used HBN 00-10 materials and IP-rated lighting for high hygiene standards in the hospital's flood-prone basement. The aesthetic scheme, chosen for colour psychology and sensory benefits, was maintained with natural stone and wood finishes, enhancing the space's relaxing nature.



FURNITURE Retail Desk DESIGN



CONSTRUCTION


The desk design uses birch plywood and Forbo's Marmoleum Furniture Linoleum, both part of a circular economy that minimises waste.

Reclaimed wood supports the frame.





ACCESSIBILITY





The modular desk design has a stool designed into the top of the structure connected using rare earth neodymium magnets. This allows an additional accessible counter top when the stool is in use.
