

The residents of Saxon meadows are a resilient community.



Design based on vapour trails created by World War Two planes.






Saxon Meadows - Planting Plan












Wolves Lane – Planting Design & Influence



The colour scheme of the areas of planting is based on the food eaten when visiting Wolves Lane. A flavour of the planting palette.

Planting contains edible plants, support plants for pollinations and plants that have traditionally been used to heal. The plants chosen create a sanctuary for people and wildlife, supporting each other in a symbiotic relationship.











Planting Plan – Gravel Garden
