The brief was developed based on the location & end user's needs. The space is an intergenerational community hub that intends to bring all generations no matter their age, ability or background.







ISOMETRIC VIEW OF THE COMMUNITY CENTRE - REVIT & ENSCAPE 🛕










BRIEF














BRIEF

The brief for this project was to redesign the West Dean Visitor's centre, located on West Dean's estate. The redesign had to provide a flexible area and an accommodating restaurant which can be the centre of the local economy. Local produce will be served in the restaurant and local materials should be incorporated into the design. Sustainability is a key aspect of the design.

The requirements for this brief was to accomodate a restaurant, with at least 120 covers indoors, a commercial kitchen as well as a more intimate chef's kitchen experience. Alongside the restaurant a marketplace, small gallery and a multifunctional events space had to be accomodated. Finally an appropriate numbers of WC's to service all of the building.







THE DESIGN PROPOSAL

The proposed final design consists of two extensions on each side of the original building. Visitors enter the space via the original part of the building where they are greeted with a generous lobby and gallery space, this makes sure all visitors take in the local art. A greeting station takes visitors to their table in the restaurant which consists of two seating areas, one in the original building and one in the left hand extension. Both providing guests with view of the landscape as well as the commercial kitchen so they are able to observe local produce being made, right in front of them. The commercial kitchen has access to a staff area and offices as well as a closed off chef's kitchen where visitors are invited to a one of a kind intimate dining experience. A veranda offers flexible seating for guests to enjoy the food out in the nature. On the right hand extension a generous space has been allocated for an events space. This space is flexible and can host different types of events creating added revenue for the restaurant. This area can be closed off for private functions or open to serve the restaurant as well. A second veranda wraps around the extension to serve this part of the building. This extension also holds inclusively designed gender neutral toilets, as well as a marketplace on the other side which continues to the outside.
